

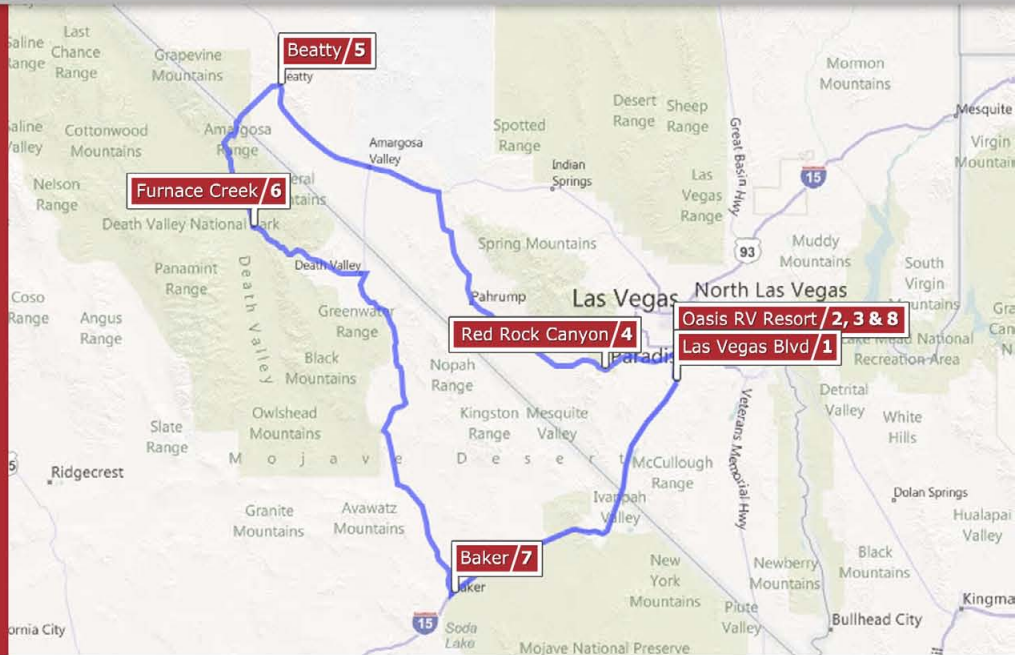
LAS VEGAS CELEBRATION

Summary

Celebrate Las Vegas style! Whatever the event, follow it with a motorhome "celebration".

Why not see the sites and sounds of Las Vegas, Red Rock Canyon and experience the incredible salt flats of Death Valley.



DAY 1 AND 2 - LAS VEGAS BOULEVARD TO LAS VEGAS OASIS RESORT 2 miles - 10 minutes

Pick up your motorhome from Las Vegas Boulevard and drive the very short journey to Las Vegas Oasis Resort (www.oasislasvegasrvresort.com), our suggested campground for two nights. Get acclimatised and prepare for tomorrow's big day enjoying the "Entertainment Capital of the World"! Why not take in one of the many shows on every night in Vegas. Cirque du Soleil have more than one show and these, plus other shows, can be booked in advance at (www.vegas.com).

DAY 3 - LAS VEGAS TO RED ROCK CANYON 47 miles - 1 hour

You can leave at your leisure as it's not far to drive to our suggested overnight campground in Red Rock Canyon (www.blm.gov). Once you have chosen your overnight stay, enjoy a relaxing day and evening.



DAY 4 - RED ROCK CANYON TO BEATTY 120 miles - 2 hour 10 minutes

Drive through the Amargosa Valley (www.amargosavalley.com) to Beatty, the nearest town before you enter Death Valley National Park (www.nps.gov). Our suggested campground is the Death Valley Inn (www.bestdeathvalleyhotels.com).

DAY 5 - BEATTY TO FURNACE CREEK, DEATH VALLEY 40 miles - 1 hour

Furnace Creek is an oasis in the middle of the desert – a lush area amidst the bare rocks, dunes and salt flats that make up Death Valley National Park. We suggest the National Park Campground adjacent to the Visitor Center. It has showers, toilets, and is a short walk from Furnace Creek Inn – a local ranch-style hotel with restaurant, golf course and horse riding. Great location for visiting all that Death Valley has to offer. (www.nps.gov)

DAY 6 - DEATH VALLEY TO BAKER 113 miles - 2 hours

Exit Death Valley on the Badwater Road, stopping at 'Badwater' the lowest point in North America. Walk out onto the salt flats and cast your eyes around the surrounding scenery.... it's like nothing you have seen before. As you exit the Park, you will go through Shoshone where you may want to stop for a beer or maybe lunch. Now drive south, through the San Bernardino

Valley, alongside Death Valley, to the town of Baker on the edge of the Mojave National Preserve (www.nps.gov). Drive south into Mojave National Preserve. Two developed, family style campgrounds, the Mid Hills Campground and Hole-in-the-Wall Campground, are available year-round. (www.nps.gov)



DAY 7 - BAKER TO LAS VEGAS 180 miles - 3 hours 15 minutes plus stopping time

Head northeast out of the Preserve toward Searchlight. Possibly you will experience national security checks as you approach the Dam itself but its totally non-invasive so no worries. At Hoover Dam (www.usbr.gov) you will be amazed at this man-made structure which controls the water from the Colorado River, feeding Nevada and California. Following this, our suggestion is that you drive back to Las Vegas Oasis Resort for your last night in the motorhome, maybe via Boulder and the Hoover Dam Museum (www.bcmha.org).

DAY 8 - OASIS RESORT TO LAS VEGAS BOULEVARD 2 miles - 10 minutes

A relaxed start to the day before returning your motorhome full of petrol to the El Monte Depot.

Travel to Death Valley not permitted July/August
